

Another busy month and a few of us have been travelling about the country looking for that next karting fix. There were two big events held in the Manawatu over Queen's Birthday Weekend. The Championship Round of WPKA Goldstar and Round 3 of the Superkart series. Thanks Steve for your account of the Superkart event. And Robert for your account of the Goldstar event.

Superkarts

Five Taranaki Superkarters made the trip to Manfield motor racing circuit over Queens Birthday Weekend for round three of the Superkart drivers series.

In cool, overcast conditions everyone was watching for the rain predicted for late in the day.

Qualifying saw the return to Superkarting of current NZ champion in the National 250 class, our own Nick Isaac. Nick was running a new Vortex engine in a Maranello chassis in the KZ2 class. Nick qualified P3 and showed he can still pedal a kart.

Matthew Barton was struggling with tuning and could only manage P6, much to his disappointment.

Peter Cottam and Stephen Beck put their karts on P3 and P4 on the grid in Rotax Max Heavy, while Logan Boyde put his Rotax Max Light rocketship on P1, the only front runner on used tyres.

Race One saw a huge crash at Turn One after an International Superkart turned

around and rolled into the path of three unlucky KZ2 drivers whose day was done. One of those was Matthew Barton, unfortunately bearing the brunt of the damage. His kart will need a lot of work before the next meeting.

Stephen Beck missed the first race with a failed starter on the grid. Peter Cottam got away safely and recorder a good 3rd place in Heavies while Logan won the first race by only one kart length.

Race Two saw Nick finish up 2nd in the KZ2, with Logan sneaking home with a narrow 0.011s victory over Tony Kinsman. Stephen Beck was not so lucky, having borrowed a starter and having to start from the rear due to missing the first race, he had to avoid a kart who locked his brakes up in front of him on the main straight early in the race. Stephen spun his kart backwards into the wall at speed, putting an end to his day. Luckily Stephen walked away OK, but is sporting some pretty sore ribs and a very second-hand looking rear end on his kart. Peter Cottam came home 3rd.

Race Three netted Nick a 2nd, Peter 3rd and Logan was home 1st with a 7s gap. This was due to putting significant grip into his kart to counter to the cold conditions.

The final race of the day saw a heart stopping incident on the main straight. Nick Isaac' KZ2 nipped up the engine at full noise and the following John Crossman had no time to react. Whilst trying to avoid the



incident, he careered into the wall with a glancing blow backwards at around 150km/hr. John was ejected out of the frame and flew onto the track surface some 20m away. Fortunately, the following karts avoided the incident and John managed to get himself off the track without serious injury, and getting attended to by the Ambulance crew. Full credit to the design of the kart for absorbing the impact and the safety gear for protecting him in what was by far the scariest karting incident I have seen in NZ.

After the restart Peter Cottam got his Rotax Heavy kart over the line for another super consistent 3rd placing for the day. Logan was pipped on the line for his first and only 2nd placing for the weekend.

Round Four of the series is back at Manfield on 01/02 July.

WPKA Goldstar

Three of our Cadet drivers (Bronson Pierce, Hamish and Euan Dwyer) travelled to race at the final event in the 2016/17 WPKA Goldstar Series. This round was run in the reverse direction, which is not run very often, so was going to be a challenge. The boys drove well and finished 10th, 11th and 12th respectively. The result from the GP was better for Hamish Dwyer, who managed 9th, ahead of Bronson in 10th and big brother Euan in 12th. Logan Smith competed against a number of drivers from around the North Island. Logan struggled with grip in the kart all day and brought his machine home in 11th. He had a better run in the GP, managing to get as high as 8th. Nathan Cox and Thomas Boniface were the Taranaki Rotax Max Junior competitors, and they faced some stiff competition. Thomas struggled with grip and a DNF in H1. Frustrated, he looped the kart in two other heats, meaning he finished up in 9th place. Nathan drove steadily all day and completed the event 12th. The GP was better for Thomas, bringing the kart from P6 to 3rd at the finish. Nathan completed the GP in 13th.

Campbell Jamieson charged hard all day in Rotax Max Light and even though he won the series, couldn't manage to get higher than 4th. Campbell didn't start the GP. A very strong contingent of Clubsport 120 Taranaki drivers were in attendance, and they shared their races with the Briggs LO206 "roadblocks". Ivan Smith was the best placed of our drivers in 7th place, with Nathan Nolly only two spots back in 9th. Roger Pepperell brought his kart to 11th place, Garth Lacey was 13th, Stuart Frew 14th, Dave Hammond 15th (suffered a DQ in H2) and Lauren Thompson rounded out the strong field in 16th place. The GP saw Stuart Frew coming home 7th, with Dave Hammond 9th. The remainder of the drivers must have been a bit too tired, as they opted not to contest the GP.

Brendon King was the only Taranaki competitor in the Open class with his might twin engine kart. Despite thrashing the kart hard all day, Brendon ended up in 5th spot. He did improve one place during the GP and nailed 4th place.

This weekend was a great reminder that travelling with your home karters can be so much fun. There is so much support for one another. Everybody leans over the fence to catch a glimpse of our drivers doing well and not so well. And when the chips are down, everyone is there to offer a few words of support. Well done to all our guys and girls who travelled, it would be great to see more of our drivers travelling to the Goldstar Series in 2017/18, as Manawatu have a strangle-hold on the Inter-Club trophy.

New Points System

• We are changing to the more conventional Positive Points system used by most Motorsport fraternities around the world. There are no longer penalty points when you miss a round. Therefore, you will only receive points if you compete and the competitor with the highest points over the 4 rounds wins. You need to compete in all 4 rounds to get maximum points for the series.

Note that with this style of points system, if you don't compete in all 4 rounds, it is unlikely that you will have enough points to be in contention for trophies.

The points system we will use is similar to the one used for WPKA Goldstar. The points will be **50** for 1st, **48** for 2nd, **47** for 3rd and so on.

Enduro Details:

Race day fees will be as per normal club day, plus \$10 per kart doing the Enduro(s).

Competitors can enter on a one day licence.

Senior Enduro entry is either:

- Class 1 Single Kart entry (can be more than one driver). Maximum of 40 minutes per driver. Finishing driver must weigh up to class weight.
- Class 2 Two Kart entry (with two or more drivers). Maximum of 40 minutes per driver. Finishing driver must weigh up to class weight.

Enduro Format & Rules:

- Each class gets three heat races (8 laps) via a three heat pre-determined grid system (some Senior classes may be combined).
- The combined points from these heats will decide grid positions for the Enduro.
- All karts must complete a minimum of 10 laps before they can make their pit stop.
- All karts MUST make at least one pit stop during the Enduro...the penalty is exclusion if you fail to stop.
- During the pit stop(s) all karts must take on a minimum of 1 litre of fuel. All refuelling must be completed under watch and in the designated area. Crews need to make sure they are prepared with fuel/tools prior to the race.

Refuelling cannot be undertaken on the grid. Cadet fuel requirements may vary due to size of fuel tanks.

- The compulsory pit stop is a minimum of 1 minute duration from when the engine is switched off in the pit chute. The driver must exit the kart in the chute and the kart must be pushed to the refuelling/repair area. Once completed, the kart can be pushed to the dummy grid for safe release back on to the track.
- Proceed SAFELY to the track under instruction from the gate marshal only, once you have been given the confirmation your 1 minute pit stop has been completed successfully.
- All karts will be weighed at the end of each respective Enduro to ensure minimum weight is achieved.
- Multiple kart entries in Senior Enduro must use only one transponder, which is fitted to the on-track kart or laps will NOT be counted...this is the crew responsibility alone.
- Multiple driver entries in Senior Enduro must have the finishing driver weigh up to class weight.
- A maximum of 40 minutes per driver in the Senior Enduro for Multiple Driver entries.

Senior Enduro Trophies:

Trophy only awarded if entry crosses the finish line

- Overall Winner
- Solo Trophy single kart entry with only 1 driver
- First KT Yamaha entry
- First Heavy Yamaha or Rotax Heavy entry
- First ClubSport First ClubSport 120 entry to complete 50 laps

There are "keepsie" trophies to 3rd place in the Enduros and for the winners of each of the senior special trophies. There are certificates and all annual trophies will be awarded at the official club prizegiving in January 2018. Some of these trophies have huge history, makes sure you are there to try and add your name to them!




