

<u>Presidents Report – Campbell</u> Jamieson

Hi All,

What a year it has been, this weekend we will be having our AGM. It's feels somewhat unbelievable that 12 months have flown by already, so what has changed for the club in this time?

In my opinion there are two positive changes which have stood out to me this year: our club's have-a-go kart fleet has doubled in size, and the income from this has more than doubled as a result. We have seen an increasing number of members represent KartSport Taranaki at other clubs around the country, and show a desire to race at a level above club days. There is some discussion to be had on these points, so starting with number one;

The have-a-go karts provide a great opportunity for growing our membership numbers. More karts provide us with the ability to condense multiple have-a-go sessions into a shorter time frame. Our four karts are set up to accommodate for different sized drivers, which helps to reduce the

workload for volunteers who were previously required to change seat and pedal positions for nearly every havea-go session. There is still more demand for these sessions, than our current group of volunteers can handle, the load does reduce in the winter. We have a preliminary plan in place to appoint a few experienced members to the committee to exclusively run have-a-go sessions, however this is still in the pipeline.

With a growing number of our drivers travelling far and wide to find competitive racing, it's good to remember that Goldstar comes around once a year, and last year we offered an incentive to enter the entire series by splitting \$1000 among all series entrants. We had 17 members compete in the series all up, 7 of which entered the entire series and won a share of the entry prize. What's more, our drivers were extremely competitive, if you've been hesitant about entering because you're not feeling competitive at club days, you might be pleasantly surprised to find yourself doing well in the series.

Additionally, the track has been really active with drivers practicing on weekends recently. I've really enjoyed meeting new members who have been preparing themselves for racing over the last few months and am looking forward to seeing you all at club days. If we haven't met yet, feel free to rock up to my van for chat on club days.
