


# Newsletter of KartSport Taranaki

Brad Still was our best finisher taking a podium place of 2<sup>nd</sup>. Sadly the weekend was not without drama as Jayden Smith's engine blew in practice putting paid to his weekends racing.

Thomas also travelled to Hamilton to race in the Pro Kart round in conjunction with the Rotax Max Challenge. Thomas had to start from the rear of the field in the heats and finished 9<sup>th</sup> in the Final after getting as high as  $3^{rd}$  in the Pre-Final and ended up  $6^{th}$ overall for the weekend.

Last month Maurice Frost attended the KartSport New Zealand Conference. The following is a few key points as discussed at conference. Thanks Maurice for putting this together for the club.

# The conference was attended by all 21 clubs. The first time in many years that every club had attended.

DD2 Presented by the executive. To include DD2 as a National Championship class. Our club was the only club prepared for discussion. General discussion amongst clubs and put to the vote. 6 *for*, 11 *against* and 4 abstained.

David Parker Manager Regional Community Sport Auckland gave a presentation on the role of the Committee. He emphasised the importance of having a strong, well balanced team. Need people who will do things and not just warm a seat.

KartSport looking to simplify club days. Less stewards, maybe only 2 depending on track. Entry on-line the day before. Competitor fills in own Scrutineering declaration cards. Random checks during the day. Gear checking through the day. Idea is to allow people to arrive later and still be ready to practice in a short time frame.

Workshops on building ideas that KartSport can progress with.

Health and Safety issues. Lots of these around karting facilities. KartSport have a working group looking to instigate simple check sheets for all clubs to use. Right down to things like camper vans using our facility having current electrical certificates.

Workshops on identifying hazards and solutions.

Calendar for NI still a mess. We do not have enough officials. Series promoters are the problem. If a completed permit is not in by the required date, the meeting will not go ahead. KartSport are expecting meetings to be cancelled.

Big push to use Facebook and websites to promote all aspects of our sport, promoting club days and permitted events.

Operation grass roots. Introduction of a Briggs and Stratton Four-Stroke engine. Aimed at a totally new market? Still not a lot of info currently.

Whangarei was named club of the year.

It will be interesting to see what impact these decision have on our club. Thanks Maurice for representing our interests.

#### More membership Information:

There are five membership types with KartSport Taranaki Inc.:

Junior – This is for a single member racing in the Cadet ROK, Cadet Raket, Junior Restricted, Vortex Mini ROK or Junior Yamaha classes

**Senior** – This is for a single member racing in any of the Senior classes

**Family** – This is for multiple members all of whom must reside at the same address

**Social** – This is for supporting members who do not wish to race or use the track (Social members cannot hire a key)

**Associate** - This is for a full member of a KSNZ affiliated club who wishes to join to participate in a local series such as WPKA Goldstar

#### Pit Shelters:

Members may hire a pit shelter for the year. Please indicate on this form if you wish to do so.

#### Key Hire:

Access to the Todd Energy Raceway is via an **annual lease key. Members may** hire a key for the year. Please indicate on this form if you wish to do so.



Only persons listed on the Membership form and holding a KSNZ licence may use the track at any time so ensure your membership type is adequate for your key hire requirements. If you have a Senior membership, but other members of your family are wanting to use the track, you need to have a Family membership and include all of those persons on the form. They must sign the form for the indemnity and hold one of the appropriate KartSport New Zealand Licences.

Please refer to the Key Hire page of the website for more information.

Please bear in mind, if you are not a KartSport NZ Racing licence holder, but have a key to the track....even if you are a member of the club you are required to hold either a "practice licence" or a "vintage licence" from KSNZ in order to take to the track. To simply turn up without this licence pleading ignorance is not acceptable. If you are at the track, please do not be offended if you are asked to produce your practice licence as this is a requirement of KSNZ. (Robert)

We had a fantastic club day in August, with 42 members racing on the day. Welcome to all the new members we have, it's great to see you at the track. Now we need to get the established members to the track also!


We have a couple of new faces on committee, so welcome to them as well. We look forward to your input guys.
