

The weather true to form caused a few hairy moments for the pit crews. But haven't we all been there. Those decisions about when to go to wets or even when to change back to slicks. Glad our pit crew didn't have to make those big calls.

I need of course to mention the rugby as we head to the pointy end of the competition, and as our next club day starts the outcome of the All Black's next game will have been decided. I'm backing the All Blacks but you never know what the French will pull out of the bag in the 11<sup>th</sup> hour. Awesome to see some of the minnow teams pulling some impressive wins too. It has certainly made morning tea a little more interesting.

This club day should be a little more exciting with the Bayley's WPKA Goldstar Series looming, just around the corner. Hopefully there will be a few extras here to take a look at the track.

A few of us travelled over to Te Puke to take part in Citrus and get a look at their track a couple of weekends ago. It was a real mixed bag of results for all of us who travelled. Starting with Logan Smith racing in Cadets who finished the weekend in 9<sup>th</sup>. After day 1 Logan was in 8<sup>th</sup>. Race 1-13<sup>th</sup>, Race 2-11<sup>th</sup>,

Race 3-6<sup>th</sup>, Race 4 he was 14<sup>th</sup>, Heat 5-7<sup>th</sup>, Heat 6-8<sup>th</sup>, and after a crash in the final in which he finished 18<sup>th</sup>, this gave him 17<sup>th</sup> overall.

Thomas contested the Mini ROK class and after being crashed into on the last lap in H1 and losing a chain, he finished 18<sup>th</sup>, Heat 2-3<sup>rd</sup>, Heat 3-4<sup>th</sup>, a really wet Heat 4-5<sup>th</sup>, Heat 5-4<sup>th</sup>, Heat 6-8<sup>th</sup>, and 18<sup>th</sup> in the final after the engine stopped. He was in 5<sup>th</sup> place going into day two and with a little bit of bad luck finished 8<sup>th</sup> overall. Dylan Frere in his debut Junior Rotax event finished Heat 1-11<sup>th</sup>, Heat 2-4<sup>th</sup>, Heat 3-13<sup>th</sup>, Heat 4-16<sup>th</sup>, Heat 5-13<sup>th</sup>, Heat 6-14<sup>th</sup>. After day 1 Dylan was sitting in 14<sup>th</sup>, and finished 14<sup>th</sup> in the Final, placing him 13<sup>th</sup> overall.

Jaden Smith raced in the Open class. Heat 1-9<sup>th</sup>, Heat 2-8<sup>th</sup>, Heat 3-8<sup>th</sup>, Heat 4-7<sup>th</sup>, and after day 1 he was sitting 8th. Day two, Heat 5-9<sup>th</sup>, Heat 6-7<sup>th</sup> and he finished the final in 7<sup>th</sup>, completing the weekend in 8<sup>th</sup>. The results do not reflect the learning that took place over the weekend and I am sure our next showing there will look a little different. I have to say, I don't get to go away with the boys as often as I like either because I need to feed the animals or because the girls have other things on over the weekends, however, I was fortunate to get away to Te Puke and it reminded me I really did like travelling to karting events. Other than the racing, it's the camaraderie between our own Club members, when things are going wrong there seems to be an ear to moan in and when things are going well there's a thumbs up. It always makes the racing more interesting when you are looking out for fellow 'Naki drivers. Aside from that there are the friendships that you make from one big event to the next, and the weekends are always good for a catch up. And at times it becomes a test of resilience, which is always good character building. And we have all had weekends when things just haven't gone our way. I look forward to a few more of us travelling off together to events.

Club days are always a good time to catch up with other 'Naki drivers to find out where the next event is and who is going. And with the Bayley's WPKA Goldstar coming up, it is a good time to consider entering. If you just want a taster, then the first round here on the 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> of November is a good chance to see what it's all about.

Congratulations to Matthew Payne who travelled to compete in the Grand Final meeting of Australia's Rotax Pro Tour series in Queensland. After setting the pace with the quickest time in qualifying for the Junior Max Trophy class (49.673s), Matthew, who turned 13 over the weekend - won all three heats on Saturday, and then went on to win both the Pre-Final and Final on Sunday! A convincing win which saw him beat the overall series class winner Reece Cohen of Australia. Well done Matthew and Gary!!

Members may hire a pit shelter for the year. Please indicate on this form if you wish to do so.

#### Key Hire:

Access to the Todd Energy Raceway is via an annual lease key. Members may hire a key for the year. Please indicate on this form if you wish to do so.

Only persons listed on the Membership form may use the track so ensure your membership type is adequate for your key hire requirements. If you have a Senior membership, but other members of your family are using the track, you need to have a Family membership and include all of those persons on the form. They must sign the form for the indemnity and MUST hold one of the appropriate KartSport New Zealand Licences.




## Did you hear...
