

We are now counting down to the Nationals and by the time I actually send this out, it will be less than 1 week to go. As a warm up, a number of Taranaki members travelled to Wellington for Rd 3 of Goldstar earlier this month. It was a really mixed weekend with incredible highs and frustrating lows. The real hard luck award though is given to Jayden Smith who was coming 3rd in the series only to be faced with engine issues on practice day, putting him out of the competition for the weekend. We all felt for him as he watched on Sunday. Brad too, had his fair share of grief. It was in heat one that his run came undone as the engine failed him. While the DNF of heat one took its toll, he has definitely got his work cut out for him at the next round in Hawkes Bay. Gary Soper and Garth Lacey battled it out for 5th & 6th place respectively in Clubsport 120, where there was some very close racing. Campbell Jamieson finished in 4th while Francois Rautenbach finished in a clear 5th place. Thomas's runs did not go to plan either after a coming together with another kart in heat 4 from P1, giving him a DNF. He came back to win heat 5 and the GP which means although he was 3rd for the day he is now in 2nd for the series, and leading the GP points. Logan Smith who is now finding his feet in the Mini ROK class, finished in 9th which does not reflect the great performances he had in what is a very competitive class. Like I said, it was a race

meeting that we really don't want to repeat.

Jonathan Dwyer competed in the Rotax Max Light class, finishing 9th overall.

Harris Krogh ran in the Cadet ROK class and for his first time out at the Wellington track did some good times and showed stamina with improvements all day.

We spent our weekend in Wellington pitted next to a few others from our home track and needless to say I know exactly why our club is on the up and up. It was great to have some team support when things went wrong, when we needed the pick me up or sounding board to nut out possible changes to kart set up. To be able to share in the success of others from our home track, is what makes karting fun and a hobby that we enjoy being part of. I do recommend that if you have never ventured away from our home track that you give it a go. It is another way to get to know the people we race amongst. And it's certainly a huge learning curve for both drivers, pit crew and supporters. You will find the results of our last club day further down in this newsletter.




